

The EMT Certificate program is currently operating using guidelines **only** that align with educational standards set forth by NREMT, Title 22 and San Diego County Department of Public Health. Students who wish to become Licensed EMTs in San Diego must complete the program and pass the NREMT Certification then apply to the San Diego County EMS Agency. All licensing is handled by the County upon which a student wishes to work.

This program **meets** the educational requirements for licensure in California. National University cannot guarantee if this program will satisfy certification in any other State. Please see the county upon which you intend to practice for more information.

All students are encouraged to apply, however due to the nature of this program it is **important** to note that you will be in proximity to individuals who have infectious diseases. In addition, students must pass both a medical exam and physical exam. Students will be required to take part in ride along programs in which they will be asked to follow guidelines of the ambulance company. These guidelines may include the regulation of facial hair, jewelry, and/or visible tattoos.

Students must also attest to a felony conviction, including all juvenile offences. This does not mean disqualification from the program however, it may hinder your ability to obtain licensure. Please see the county agency upon which you wish to work for more information.
